- Mandatory for all fifth graders who did not participate in the science fair. 5th graders may not have more than 2 students per project.
- Projects can be demonstrations, an experiment, or an invention. Rubrics are attached.
- Science fair participants are invited to bring their projects back so they can teach others what they learned.
- Display boards are not required but a poster board hanging from the display with a title and name is required.
- 3rd and 4th grades participate by choice. In 3rd and 4th this could be a class project, a science group (4 person) project, paired project or an individual project.
- We are not as restricted as the Science Fair. As long as proper safety precautions are taken, students may have animal displays, mild explosions (as in mentos and sprite, for example), and projectiles.
- Proper safety precautions means: goggles, gloves, parental supervision, etc. (as determined by each science teacher).
- The morning of the science share students will take their desks outside their classroom and set up their project. As others tour the scholars will explain their project.
- Parents are encouraged to present.
- All school personnel are encouraged to present. For example, Mrs. Doerfler is going to show how to use extreme temperature change to easily peel a potato. She will need space around her to create a safety zone. She will be wearing goggles.
