



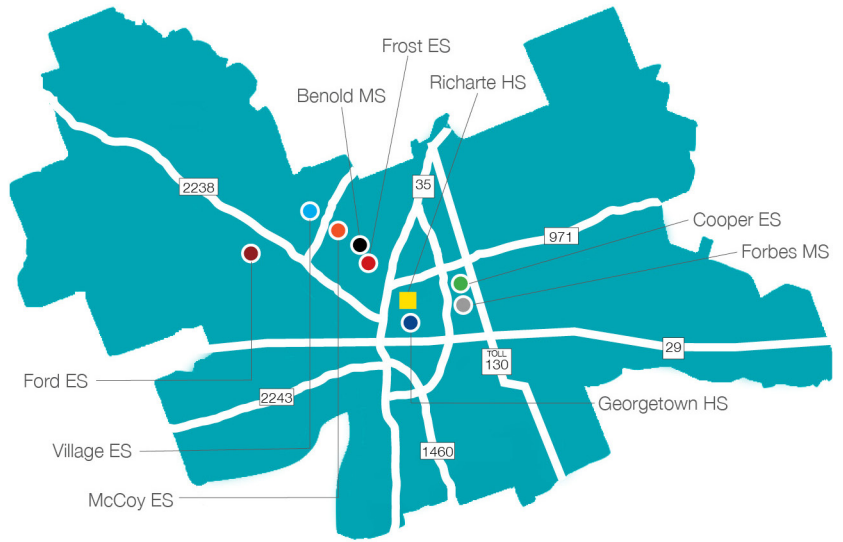

- **Dual language program** is offered at Village and Cooper. A 50/50 model delivers English and Spanish instruction to teach children a second language through content instruction and conversation.
- **SeaPerch** (underwater robotics) incorporates STEM curriculum to teach skills in ship and submarine design. More than 50 teams participate on 15 campuses.

- GISD is committed to producing future-ready graduates. Approximately **60 career and technology education (CTE)** courses are offered including aerospace engineering, veterinary science, accounting, biotechnology, culinary arts, law enforcement, agriculture, game programming and design, audio/video production and automotive technology.
- More than **50 Dual Credit courses** allow students to earn college credit through Austin Community College. Additionally, GISD offers nearly **30 Advanced Placement (AP)** classes.
- Robust **visual and performing arts** offerings include musical theater, show choir, marching band, color guard and orchestra.
- **Athletic opportunities** are extensive and include award-winning swim, soccer, baseball and basketball programs.
- **SeaPerch** students compete annually in competition and have qualified for the national competition.
